

Hundreds of musicians gathered in Toronto to make some beautiful music together, to celebrate hockey and to break a world record.

Shoppers and people roaming around Dundas Square on Sunday afternoon heard 930 saxophone players, all blowing the same tune. It wasn't a mellow jazz melody, but the theme to Hockey Night In Canada.

The musicians played hockey-related songs for a five-minute period, hopefully allowing them to grace the pages of the Guinness Book of World Records. The group hopes it surpasses the record set last January in the Netherlands where 321 musicians played together.

But according to Guinness, the T.O. group's attempt would constitute a world best in the category of most saxophonists playing a single song at one time.

Bobbi Beeson, a spokeswoman for the event said an official registration is being shipped to Guinness in England for acknowledgment.

She said the Hockey Night In Canada theme was chosen to honour the Calgary Flames' quest for the Stanley Cup.
